This workshop provides an overview of the theory and practice of qualitative interviews as a well-established and widely used method of data collection in qualitative research.

Description

During the workshop a range of qualitative interview techniques will be discussed and their potential application and challenges considered. Pragmatic and technical issues of generating interview data will also be addressed.

Additionally, this workshop engages with the participants' own interview guides which will be further developed in a practical manner.

Topics covered also include documentation, anonymization, and transcription.

Participants will be invited to submit interview guides prior to the workshop. More detailed information will be made available when the registration process is completed.
